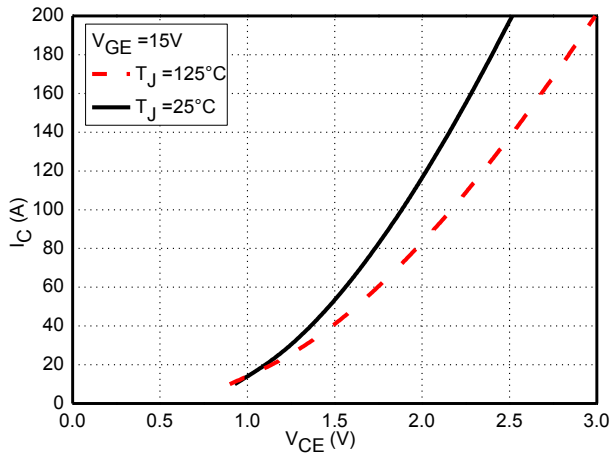


Fig.1 Typical IGBT Saturation Characteristics

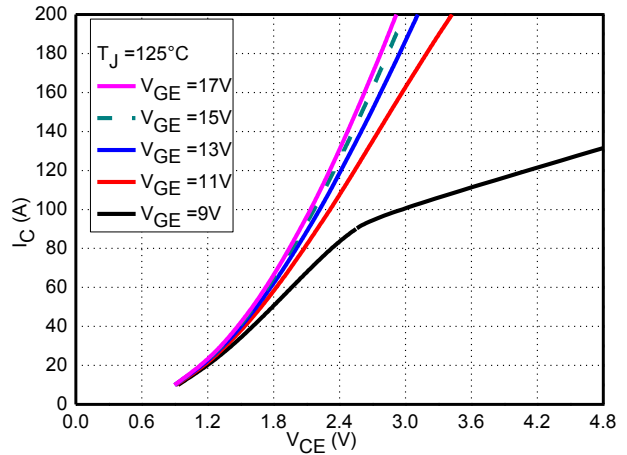


Fig.2 Typical IGBT Output Characteristics

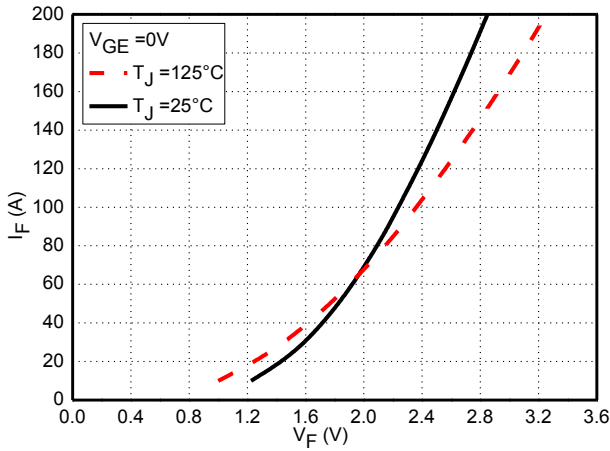


Fig.3 Typical Diode Forward Characteristics

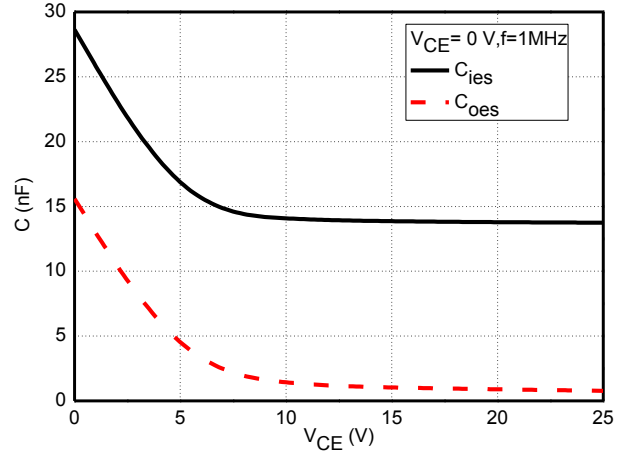


Fig. 4 Typical Capacitance Characteristics

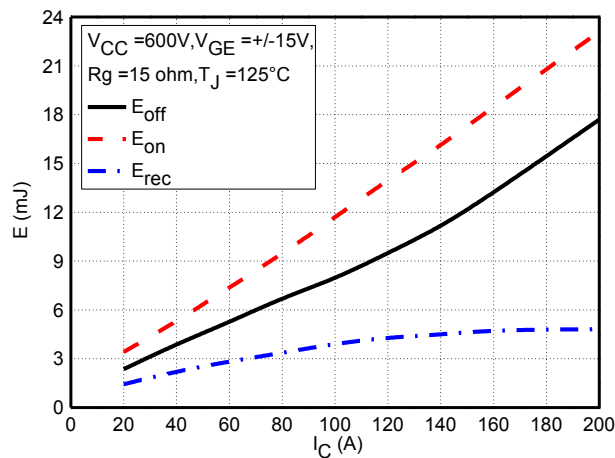


Fig.5 Typical Switching Loss vs. Collector Current

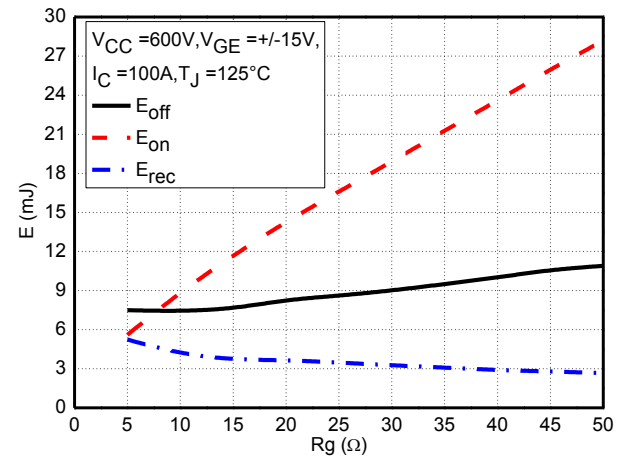


Fig.6 Typical Switching Loss vs. Gate Resistance
